

## Year 1 Autumn Newsletter

Hello and welcome to Year One!

The Year 1 Team would like to start by thanking you for sending your smart, happy and excited children into school at the beginning of term. We have spent a few days getting to know the children and allowing them to familiarise themselves with our school Mission Statement.

Here is a brief outline of our curriculum for this term and how you can continue to support your child at home.

	How you can help:
<p><b>English</b> Labels, lists and captions</p> <p>Senses poetry</p> <p>Instructions</p> <p>Stories with familiar settings</p>	<p>-When reading non-fiction books, discuss any labels, lists and captions</p> <p>- Discuss your child's senses with them and help them to explore lots of different materials through taste, sight, touch etc.</p> <p>- Follow instructions (playing a game / following a recipe etc.) and discuss how they are put together e.g. a list of what you need, numbered points in the correct order</p> <p>- Share books set in places your child has been and discuss what happened while they were there</p>
<p><b>Maths</b> Number Bonds to 5, 10, 6, 7, 8 and then 9</p> <p>Number - counting, adding and subtraction</p> <p>Money - coin recognition, making different amounts</p> <p>Shape space and measure - longer/ shorter, heavier/ lighter, wide/ narrow</p> <p>Data handling - sorting, pictograms and block graphs</p> <p>Time - recognise and use time vocabulary and learn o'clock times</p>	<p>- Number bonds are numbers that combine to make another number. Begin by playing games to learn all the <b>Number Bonds to 5</b> (0+5 / 1+4 / 2+3 / 3+2 / 4+1 / 5+0)</p> <p>- Count as many different objects as you can! Combine two groups of objects</p> <p>- Tip your purse out! Look for loose change and see how much is there. Give your child some money to spend in the shop and help them to find the right amounts.</p> <p>- Look for shapes around the home. Why have they been used for that object? e.g. a football will roll.</p> <p>- Help your child to write numbers correctly - in the sand at the beach, painting, drawing, making them out of playdough etc.</p> <p>- Discuss times of your child's day e.g. when they have breakfast, go to bed etc.</p>
<p><b>RE - Come &amp; See</b> Families</p> <p>Belonging</p> <p>Judaism</p> <p>Waiting</p>	<p>- Gather photos of your family</p> <p>- Talk about the people in your family</p> <p>- Play family games e.g. snap</p> <p>- Discuss any groups or clubs that the children belong to and how this makes them feel</p> <p>- Gather Baptism artefacts such as photographs, clothing, candles to share in school</p> <p>- Discuss the importance of belonging to God's family</p> <p>- Discuss their new learning about the stories of Abraham and Moses</p> <p>- Discuss times of waiting and how children feel while they wait e.g. waiting for a birthday or a holiday</p> <p>- Discuss the importance of Advent and how we wait for the coming of Jesus using Advent wreaths and calendars</p>

<b>Science</b> Seasonal Changes  Materials	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Discuss the changes in the seasons. Why are so many things you enjoy doing dependent on the time of the year and the weather?</li> <li>- Discuss different objects and the materials they are made out of and why</li> </ul>
<b>Computing</b> Algorithms	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Together, make a set of simple instructions for others to follow (e.g. directions to cross the living room and to go around any obstacles)</li> </ul>
<b>Art and Design</b> Self Portraits  Moving Pictures	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Look at portraits by Van Gogh</li> <li>- Look at photographs of the family. What do they say about them?</li> <li>- Visit the Art Gallery. What do the portraits tell us about the person? (Walker Art Gallery portrait trails are excellent!)</li> <li>- Look at how these are operated e.g. in pop up books and cards</li> </ul>
<b>Geography</b> Weather and the Seasons	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Discuss seasonal changes and indicators of seasonal change</li> <li>- Collect different colour leaves and compare and discuss</li> </ul>
<b>PE</b> Games and Gymnastics — Rolling Games — Travelling with a ball  Dance — Scarecrow dance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Practise rolling/throwing/catching/striking/balancing</li> <li>- Encourage your child to devise their own games. These could involve scoring points, adding and subtracting</li> <li>- Think of the way a scarecrow might move in the fields</li> </ul>
<b>Music</b> Matching Pitch  Fruit and Veg songs  Charanga — Hey You!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Explore sounds made by untuned instruments, voice or any household object. How do we make a noise with it? e.g. tap, shake, bang, twist etc.</li> <li>- Learn the songs for our Harvest Festival when they come home! (PLEASE!!)</li> </ul>
