To support and develop your child's mathematical fluency, encourage problem solving and investigation skills using real life application. Count forwards and backwards from random numbers to consolidate learning and improve efficiency in addition and subtraction.

This information will give you an idea of the work covered over this term. It will suggest activities that you can carry out at home, things to do and where you can go to find more information. Science

Homework

Homework mats will be given out at the beginning of half term focusing on literacy and numeracy. Please return the mats in the last week of term to your class teacher.
All children will have a reading book and are listened to once a week as part of a guided reading group. This book will be sent home for you to share with your child. Reading wallets should be brought to school every day so that books are protected. Please ensure that the books are returned to school promptly so that sets are kept in tact for the next group.
As your child begins to read longer texts, it will become impossible to read the whole book in one sitting.

The learning of times tables for 2, 5, 10, 3, 4 and 8 (in that order) will be ongoing.

Housekeeping

Please make sure your child has a P.E kit in school including trainers for outdoor PE.

All school belongings should be clearly labelled with your child's name on them. Fruit can be brought to school to be eaten as a snack at playtime. Your child's water bottle should be clearly labelled and brought home at the end of each day so that the bottle is emptied and cleaned.
